The Mainichi Newspapers	Works in which <i>The Mainichi Newspapers Co., Ltd.</i> holds the copyright published on Mainichi Digital (https://mainichi.jp/) and The Mainichi (English website) (https://mainichi.jp/english/), excluding paid-content articles. Note: "Sponichi" (https://mainichi.jp/sponichi/) is excluded.
The Sankei Shimbun	Works in which <i>The Sankei Shimbun Co., Ltd.</i> holds the copyright published on Sankei News (https://www.sankei.com/), excluding paid-content articles.
The Nikkei	Works in which <i>Nikkei Inc.</i> holds the copyright published on Nikkei Online Edition (https://www.nikkei.com/) and Nikkei Asia (https://asia.nikkei.com/), excluding paid-content articles.

Note 1: **Paid-content articles**

Articles requiring a **subscription agreement** to view. Representative examples are as follows:

- **Page-viewer editions** presented in the same format as the printed newspaper.
- Articles fully available only to paid subscribers, typically marked with notices such as *"subscription required beyond this point"*.

Note 2: **Free-content articles**

Articles accessible **in whole or in part without logging in or holding a subscription.**

Note 3: **Copyright exceptions**

With respect to works for which copyright is owned by each newspaper publisher, representative examples of works **whose copyright does not belong to the publisher** include **contributed articles, reader submissions**, serialized novels, and radio or television program listings.
